I have attached to this email an excel file with all the names and addresses of each of the signatories. I have also attached another three files: the pdf contains a scanned copy of the signatures collected and the other Excel file has the list of emails of those who replied to my email (this file is protected by password). You will receive a separate email with the password to open it. The covering letter attached is for your perusal. I can send you the originals should you require them. We think this is the right way to collect signatories: only genuine residents' opinions count. This is a petition which is not open to abuse from signatures taken from people living further afield and wishing to continue to use our streets as rat runs.

I contacted neighbours mainly by email while other petitioners have helped to obtain actual signatures on the doorstep. I promised I would only disclose the names/addresses/emails to you for the purpose of presenting the petition to the Council: I trust the personal information will be kept confidential. We didn't get answers from every household, as many are shielding, and some flats/houses are currently empty. From those who answered the support is extremely strong: 95% on WG and 85% on WGL.

This petition has been coordinated with others across the 'Hills & Vales' neighbourhood, to ensure consistency and to avoid overlapping. Please consider this petition in conjunction to the similar one carried out on Point Hill and the other feeder streets (Winforton St, etc.)
