Mr Cox,

With regards to the Late Temporary Event Notice 14262 at 12 Spray Street, between 20:00 on the 26/08/2022 and 03:00 on the 27/08/2022, Police Licensing object to the TEN under the Prevention of Crime objective and the Prevention of Public Nuisance.

On the 10th July 2022, the premises operated past their terminal hour resulting in disorder and violence at the location. The DPS did not report the incidents to Police due to late opening and conducting licensable activities. CCTV was requested from the premises and the DPS was unable to provide a copy of this or demonstrate working CCTV equipment. It is a concern of Police Licensing that the late terminal hour will cause a disturbance being close to local residences and the without working CCTV there will be a likelihood of any offences going unreported and undetected, posing a danger to staff and attendees.
