This will ensure that its lines of enquiry are addressed, information provided is relevant and appropriate and scrutiny practice is effective and well directed.
- 3.2 Should the Panel wish to remove any items of business or proposed that they be taken at alternative meetings, they should make such comments and advisement at this meeting.
- 3.3 Should the Panel wish to add any new items of business, clear details of what is being sought must be put to the Chair and agreement sought with the Chair of Overview & Scrutiny, before it is added to any individual meeting schedule.

3.4 The Chair of the Community Safety and Environment Scrutiny Panel proposes that the Panel should undertake an in depth review of the work of the Safer Neighbourhood Panels to assess their contribution to reducing crime across the borough. If the Panel agrees to this proposal, then a detailed project plan would be considered at the next meeting of the Panel in November
